Budget Highlights Fund 100 – Water Enterprise Operations

Major Assumptions Include:

- Board approved 5.5% rate increases in calendar years 2025 and 2026
- Treated Water Sales
 - > 34,000 AF (2025)
 - > 35,000 AF (2026)
- Untreated Water Sales
 - > 5,000 AF (2025 and 2026)







Fund 120 – Renewal/Replacement and System-wide Improvements Capital Investments

Planned Capital Projects for FY 2024-25 and FY 2025-26 include:

Chain of Lakes Conveyance System \$2.4M

DVWTP and PPWTP HVAC Replacement \$1.8M

Mocho Wellfield PFAS Treatment Facility \$9.6M

PPWTP Improvements and Replacements \$6.2M

Regional Project Feasibility Study \$900K

Silver Oaks Pump Station Replacement \$3.7M







Budget Highlights Fund 110 – State Water Facilities Fund 130 – Water Enterprise Expansion


Fund 110

- No increase to property tax override
 - > \$22M (FY 2025 and FY 2026)

Fund 130

- \$10M assumption for connection fee revenue (FY 2025 and FY 2026)
- Connection fee revenue has been on a decline since FY 2018-19
- Upcoming connection fee study to evaluate:
 - > Future connections in the service area
 - > Allocation of projects to Expansion fund

Budget Highlights Fund 200 – Flood Protection Operations Fund 210 – Flood Protection Development Impact Fee

Fund 200

- 2023 Storm Repair Project is funding priority
- FY 2024-25: \$11.7M
 - > Army Corp of Engineers repair of 48 sites Agency to pay 20% (~\$8M)
 - > \$3.7M allocated to repair 6 high priority sites
- FY 2025-26: \$7M
 - > Repair of 24 damaged sites
- Grants: \$2.6M assumed from FEMA/CAL OES

Fund 210

 Fund portion of next phase of the Flood Management Plan
