Provide the Agency with effective leadership, administration, and governance.




# Background





### Hazard Mitigation Plans


- Planning document
- Meet federal requirements under the Disaster Mitigation Act
- Required for eligibility for funding in FEMA's nonemergency grant programs





What is a Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP)?

- Considers natural hazard risk, but may also consider other risks
- Fosters public participation, interagency coordination, and hazard awareness





### Zone 7's HMP History

• The 2023 HMP is an update to Zone 7's 2018 HMP





## Zone 7 HMP Objectives

- Evaluate hazard risk for Zone 7 operations
- Identify long-term strategies for risk reduction
- Increase internal and public hazard awareness
- Engage with the public and interested parties
- Continue to track and consider opportunities to leverage federal grant funding for hazard mitigation

# Study Components

- Review of the 2018 Plan
- Review of other relevant Zone 7 plans
- Zone 7 facilities and services risk assessment
- Local hazard vulnerability analysis
- Asset inventory and loss estimates
- Long-term mitigation strategy development
- Inclusion of vulnerable populations and climate change





# Study Process

- Convened 14-person steering committee
- Five workshops/meetings to contribute to:
  - Update HMP goals
  - Evaluate hazards
  - Develop mitigation strategies
- Public Outreach
  - Meetings/workshop, online survey, comment period

#### 2023 HMP Goal Statements

- Protect life and property
- Improve Emergency Preparedness and Management Capability
- Protect the Environment
- Promote Public Awareness and Outreach



## Hazard Evaluation

• Evaluated 9 hazards via a FEMA's methodology



- Considered Zone 7's exposure and vulnerability to the hazard, as well as the likelihood of occurrence of each hazard
  - Exposure considers whether an asset is in the hazard area (e.g., in the floodplain)
  - Vulnerability considers the how susceptible the asset is to damage from the hazard (e.g., building type, foundation height)
  - Likelihood of occurrence considers the probability of the hazard event occurring (e.g., the probability of a flood of a certain magnitude)



# Hazard Evaluation

- Hazard ranking reflects the combination of exposure, vulnerability, and likelihood of occurrence
- Flood/Severe Storms and Drought had the highest hazard ranking
- Hazards considered with reference to Zone 7 jurisdiction
- Vulnerable populations considered in accordance with new guidance.

Moderately High	None
Moderate	Flood/Severe Storm Drought
Moderately Low	WildfireEarthquakeUtility LossInfrastructure FailureWater ContaminationDam FailureTerrorism/Adversarial Events
Low	None



## **Conceptual Mitigation Actions**

- Guidelines require development of mitigation actions
- Plan identifies and ranks 25 conceptual mitigation actions
- These actions will be considered and prioritized through Zone 7's existing budgetary and planning processes





### Next Steps

- The Plan is Conditionally Approved by FEMA
- Board approval of the 2023 HMP is required to achieve Final Approval
- The plan maintains Zone 7's eligibility status to pursue FEMA mitigation grant funding
- Staff will continue to evaluate opportunities to leverage FEMA mitigation grant funding
