

## Zone 7's Current Water Supply

#### 2018-2022 Average Water Supply



- Zone 7 stores excess imported water:
  - Locally Livermore Valley Groundwater Basin
  - Downstream San Luis Reservoir & Kern County Storage and Recovery Program
- Zone 7 relies on SWP facilities to import water stored downstream
- Zone 7 is seeking to diversify water supply portfolio in response to declining SWP reliability

## LVE Overview

#### **Project Description**

- Expand Los Vaqueros Reservoir to increase storage capacity by 115,000 acre-feet (AF)
- Construct Transfer-Bethany Pipeline
- Total project cost: \$1.38B (future \$)

#### **Benefits**


Project partners will buy-in to storage capacity and/or conveyance capacity

- Enhances water supply reliability in the Bay Area
- Improves environmental water management



## LVE Operations

- CCWD's operations take first priority and remaining capacity is shared by other participants
- Zone 7 would be responsible for providing water supplies
- Zone 7's current participation assumes up to 10,000 AF of storage
- Zone 7 would take delivery via the Transfer-Bethany Pipeline

## Multi-Party Agreement (MPA)

- Current MPA and its amendments fund the project through June 30, 2023
- MPA Amendment No. 5 will fund LVE through June 30, 2024
  - Cost to Zone 7: \$1,239,000
  - Funding is included in the FY 2023-24 Amended Budget for Fund 100 - Water Enterprise Operations and Fund 130 - Water Enterprise Capital Expansion.



## LVE's Benefits & Costs to the Tri-Valley

#### **Benefits**

- Up to 10,000 AF of upstream local storage
- Operational flexibility for timing of water deliveries from the Kern County Storage and Recovery Program
- Alternative conveyance in case of Banks Pumping Plant outage in the Delta

#### <u>Costs</u>

- Estimated share of capital cost: \$53M (future \$)
- Estimated annual cost once project is fully operational ranges from \$4.4M to \$6.3M (future \$)
- Estimated unit cost: \$2,700/AF (2031 \$)
  - Includes debt service, O&M, and usage fees. Excludes cost of water supply source.
- Costs are being updated in upcoming work



## Staff Recommendation

 Given LVE's potential benefits to Zone 7, staff recommends continued participation in the project through the Multi-Party Agreement Amendment No. 5 to allow continued evaluation of the costs and benefits of the project to the Tri-Valley
